



Everyone loves the warmth and charm of a woodstove; it just makes a home so comfortable.

The following will help ensure many years of worry-free enjoyment.

- Be sure the stove is certified safe and clean-burning, and meets the CSA B415 performance standard.
- Obtain a permit from your municipal building department, and have them inspect your stove.
- Contact your insurance broker to determine if the stove will affect your premiums, and notify them when the installation is complete.
- Hire a qualified professional to install your stove. If you install it yourself, follow the instructions closely, and consult an expert if you're unsure of anything.
- Install smoke detectors high up near the exit of the room.
- Have an ABC certified fire extinguisher easily accessible, and make sure family members know how to use it. Check the extinguisher monthly and have it serviced annually.

In addition, we suggest you:

- Install the stove in your main living area for most effective heating.
- Use a compatible chimney, and only recommended firewood or other fuel.
- Be sure your house is as energy efficient as possible in order to use less fuel.
