Wood Matters

Always burn **dry, seasoned** wood.

Doing so will prevent many problems commonly associated with woodstoves.



Properly maintained woodstoves can be a safe option for heating for many remote properties.

Keep it Clean

Regularly remove **ashes** and place them in a **metal container *with a lid*** away from your house.

Don't ever

Start a stove fire with **fuel** or flammables.

Burn **garbage** in a woodstove unless you want to start a chimney fire.
